

I have a <u>Grants and Funding</u> section on my website, which is updated with links and application details each time a new grant becomes available.

Recent additions have included the <u>Adding Value Grant</u>, from Defra, which is available to growers or producers to add value to products once they have been harvested or reared; and the <u>Museums and Galleries Improvement Fund</u>, to allow venues to improve displays, enhance collections and make exhibitions more accessible to visitors.

The webpage also includes grants for businesses, schools, libraries and music venues, in addition to a section for grants promoting energy-saving and sustainability, and I encourage everyone to consider visiting my website to investigate what you may be eligible for.

#### Food Strategy launched

The Government's new <u>Food Strategy</u> is good news for farmers, food producers and consumers here in Copeland.

With plans to boost food production in key sectors, drive innovation and harness new technology, the Strategy will support domestic production, create jobs and grow our local economy.



It also sets out the importance of maintaining and boosting food security, including plans to strengthen the resilience of our supply chains and boost domestic production to help protect against future economic shocks and crises.

From spending on innovation, to releasing additional visas for seasonal workers and creating career pathways in the sector, the announcements will provide a real boost.

**Community Ownership Fund opens for applications** 



The second round of of the Government's Community Ownership Fund is now open.

Groups in Copeland can apply to the £150m fund to protect venues in their area that could otherwise be lost forever.

This Levelling Up funding allows groups to take control of - or redevelop - assets including historic buildings, community centres, pubs and sports facilities.

The deadline to submit an expression of interest is July 29, 2022.

### Apply for Help to Build

The Government's <u>Help to Build</u> scheme is now open for applications.

The scheme makes self- and custom-build an affordable option for home ownership and is one of many schemes by the Government to help people on to the housing ladder.

### Broadband funding available

Up to £2 million of additional funding from Cumbria County Council is now available to help homes and businesses in rural areas of Cumbria get access to much faster and more

reliable internet connections.

Vouchers from the Government's Gigabit Broadband Voucher Scheme (GBVS) are currently available in Cumbria to subsidise the costs of bringing gigabit broadband to areas suffering with slow speeds.

#### Pension Credit available

I am supporting a campaign to encourage those eligible to apply for Pension Credit to help with the cost of living.

Pension Credit is a top-up for vulnerable pensioners, worth an average of £3,300, and while there are 1,698 claimants in Copeland, there remains 25 per cent of people entitled to this support who do not claim it.,
