Physical activity boost

It is excellent news that Cumbria has been named as one of 11 pilot areas to receive Government funding for a scheme to encourage physical activity. Cumbria County Council will receive £1.5m from a £12.7m pot to allow social prescriptions - including walking, wheeling and cycling - to be offered by GPs as part of a new trial to improve mental and physical health.

It is also welcome news that the Coast to Coast route, stretching from St Bees to Robin Hood's Bay in North Yorkshire, has been designed as a <u>new National Trail</u>. Natural England will work alongside partners to improve the 197-mile route, with £5.6 million committed for upgrades.

Funding for farming projects

I am pleased to report that farming projects in Copeland have received more than £117,000 in grants in the first year of the Government's <u>Farming in Protected</u> <u>Landscapes</u> programme.

The Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra) programme provides funding for farmers and other land managers to work in partnership with National Parks and Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty bodies to deliver projects for climate, nature, people and place.

Successful projects include those in Seascale, Keswick, Nether Wasdale, Millom and Muncaster.

• In other Defra funding news, the <u>Cumbria Coastal Community Forest</u> has been allocated almost £900,000 in extra funding to plant trees and create new woodlands along a 56-mile stretch of the western coast of Cumbria.

Significant progress for Town Deal bids

Business cases have now been submitted to the Government as the final pieces in the jigsaw to secure over £40 million of investment in Copeland.

This is a significant milestone in the Town Deal process to draw down the earmarked funding of £22.5m for <u>Cleator Moor</u> and £20.6m for <u>Millom</u> for a series of transformational projects in each community.



Safety funding announced

I welcome the announcement that the Government has made an extra £50 million available to communities as part of the fourth round of the Safer Streets Fund.

Cumbria Police and Crime Commissioner Peter McCall has successfully secured funding for crime-prevention projects in the county in all three rounds so far.

The £191,583 received for Whitehaven in round three has paid for new lighting and CCTV in Castle Park. It is also funding Active Bystander Training for almost 1,000 people, including security staff, school pupils and youth groups, to influence the culture of reporting and preventing unacceptable behaviour towards women.

The newly-announced £50m takes the Safer Streets Funding total to £120m to tackle neighbourhood crime, anti-social behaviour, and violence against women and girls.

• The Ministry of Justice has committed £780,000 funding that will go to support victims of domestic abuse and sexual violence in our county. Organisations receiving the funding are Gateway4Women, Safety Net, The Birchall Trust, West Cumbria Domestic Violence (The Freedom Project) and Women' Community Matters, and the money can be used to support existing clients, as well as new referrals.

Business support extended

The Government's <u>Help to Grow: Digital</u> scheme offers businesses discounts worth up to £5,000 on approved software.

Previously, only businesses with more than five employees were eligible for the scheme. But now, businesses with at least one employee are now eligible to benefit.

Bright Stars recognised



Congratulations to all the schools who took part in this year's Centre for Leadership Performance Bright Stars challenge.

Pupils were given an initial £50 and had eight weeks to work with their business mentor to make a profit, and also make a difference to their community.

Copeland schools were well represented this year and I'd like to commend all who took part: Bookwell, Gosforth, Jericho, Mayfield, Monkwray, Moor Row, Seascale, St Bees Village, St Bega's, St Bridget's (Parton), St James' Infant and Nursery, St Mary's, Montreal and Valley.

Chance to take part in Parliament Week

With both Ponsonby and Calderbridge Parish Council and Beckermet With Thornhill Parish Council, we had extremely productive discussions regarding energy generation, timescales, infrastructure, visual/environmental impact and skills, and I look forward to the conversation continuing.
