



It's excellent news that around 60,000 rural premises in Cumbria are to benefit from lightning-fast broadband following a $\pounds 108$ million government contract award.

This Project Gigabit investment will benefit hard-to-reach homes and businesses, and beyond delivering gigabit-capability, it is a huge boost for jobs and skills in Cumbria.

Fibrus – the firm awarded the contract – has committed to creating at least 90 apprenticeships following the government investment.

Deployment of the new infrastructure in our county has already started, and implementation will run until 2025 with the first connections anticipated in Spring 2023.

This is an important step in future-proofing Copeland's connectivity needs for future generations and creating opportunities, levelling up local communities.

SMR progress for Copeland

It was extremely exciting this month to host the launch of the new development company that will bring small modular reactors (SMRs) to Copeland.

The <u>Solway Community Power Company</u> – chaired by Paul Foster – has been formed with one mission; to bring Rolls-Royce SMRs to land adjacent to Sellafield. Two 470MW reactors are planned, and there is potential for more.



The company – based in Copeland – has been created as a direct request from myself and the local community to drive this project forward. We have the site, skills and supply chain – and the need for new, clean and reliable nuclear power is urgent. All the pieces of the jigsaw are there, and now we have the vehicle to pull them all together and make it happen.

This is a significant milestone for Copeland and I have absolute confidence – shared by the development company and Rolls-Royce SMR – that our SMR ambitions will be achieved and be on the bars by 2030.

Town Deal investment confirmed



It is truly fantastic news that both <u>Cleator Moor</u> and <u>Millom</u> have had their full Town Deal funding confirmed, which will bring a staggering £70.2m into our communities.

The announcement from the Government of \pounds 22.5m and \pounds 20.6m for Cleator Moor and Millom respectively – in addition to the \pounds 27.1m match-funding pledged – will be transformational for Copeland.

Eight exciting projects across both towns will now become a reality, bringing about significant benefits in employment, regeneration, highways, health, leisure and tourism – both now and for generations to come.

Milestone achievement for Wild Ennerdale

I am delighted that Natural England has declared <u>Wild Ennerdale as a National Nature</u> <u>Reserve</u>, protecting over 3,000 hectares of beautiful landscape of water, forests and mountains.

Funding secured for arts organisations

It's wonderful news that two arts and cultural organisations in the Copeland constituency will receive a share of $\pounds 446m$ Government funding each year for the next three years.

Cumbria Theatre Trust, which operates Keswick Theatre by the Lake, will receive £615,182 per year and Rosehill Theatre will receive £208,523 per year – bringing the funding for Copeland to £823,705 per year and almost £2.5 million in total.

The funding has been delivered by the Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport, and Arts Council England.

Grant funding available



Grant funding is available from <u>Cumbria County Council</u> for tree-planting schemes which can range in size and include different types of planting – from single trees or hedgerows to large-scale woodland.

There is also funding available to support communities in accessing these green spaces, including footpaths, benches and interpretation boards.

The grants are available as part of the Cumbria Coastal Community Forest project, aimed to introduce more trees into the landscape along the western coast of Cumbria.

 The Nuclear Decommissioning Authority (NDA) has <u>pledged £200,000 to the</u> <u>project</u>, providing a lasting legacy to the people of Cumbria, its wildlife and the environment.
