



I am pleased to share the news that £440,000 in extra funding is being invested into the Lake District National Park to protect and conserve our natural environment and widen access to our scenic beauty spots, supporting tourism and growing the economy.

The Government has announced that all 10 National Park Authorities will benefit from an equal share of the additional £4.4 million funding. The extra investment will support services for visitors, including education and visitor centres, ranger services, new trails, residential programmes, and provide more opportunities for people to enjoy National Parks.

All 10 National Park Authorities are being awarded the additional grant in recognition of the vital role that National Parks play to protect our precious wildlife, our world famous scenery, and support the tourism sector.

The new funding will support access and engagement programmes that are helping to conserve the natural beauty and wildlife of these protected landscapes for future generations to enjoy.

The Government has also confirmed that the Farming in Protected Landscapes (FIPL) scheme, delivered across 10 National Parks and 34 Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty since 2021, has been extended until March 2025 to continue supporting custodianship of our world renowned natural heritage.

Household discounts available

A number of constituents who live in park homes have contacted me to enquire about accessing the £400 energy bills discount.

Applications are now open to the Alternative Funding Scheme for those who did not qualify for the previous household discount, including people who live in park homes, houseboats and those who are not on a mains electricity/gas grid.

Boost for electric vehicles

It is excellent news that Cumbria is to receive a further £1.4m of funding to install 900 new Electric Vehicle chargepoints across the county.

The <u>Department for Transport funding</u> will be topped up by £500,000 of private investment to create 780 chargepoints within streetlights or new charging bollards, and a further 120 in car parks.

Changing Places funding

Copeland Borough Council will be working with Ravenglass and Eskdale Railway Company to create <u>fully accessible changing facilities</u> at its Ravenglass Station.

The Changing Places room will provide life-enhancing freedoms for people with additional needs to visit and enjoy our area, and has been made possible with £68,000 of Government funding.
