Schools funding welcomed



It's extremely welcome news that schools in Copeland will receive an extra £1.859.947 from the Government - both in this academic year and next year too. Every state school in England is receiving an additional cash boost as part of £2 billion worth of new Government investment in education.

Allocated on a per-pupil basis, a typical primary school will receive approximately £35,000 and a typical secondary school approximately £200,000; the first payments are being made next week and schools are able to determine how this extra money is spent.
